

Adding Tags to Statements

WALT: add tags to the end of sentences, making them into questions.

A tag is a short add on to a sentence or statement.

An affirmative/positive tag is added to a negative statement.

A negative tag is added to a positive /affirmative statement.

Examples:

1. He chose that rose. (Affirmative/Positive Statement)
He chose that rose, **didn't he?** (Affirmative /Positive Statement with **Negative Tag**)
2. You shouldn't drive like that. (Negative Statement)
You shouldn't drive like that, **should you?** (Negative Statement with **Positive Tag**)

Complete the following statements, adding a negative OR affirmative tag making them into questions.

Affirmative/Positive Statements:

1. You got lost in the maze.
2. Tom is tall.
3. He is a wise man.

Negative Statements:

1. My cake won't rise.
2. We didn't dive in the pool.
3. You can't do your homework.
