Adding Tags to Statements

<u>WALT</u>: add tags to the end of sentences, making them into questions.

A tag is a short add on to a sentence or statement.

An affirmative/positive tag is added to a negative statement.

A negative tag is added to a positive /affirmative statement.

Examples:

- He chose that rose. (Affirmative/Positive Statement) He chose that rose, didn't he? (Affirmative /Positive Statement with Negative Tag)
- You shouldn't drive like that. (Negative Statement) You shouldn't drive like that, should you? (Negative Statement with Positive Tag)
