<u>Unit 3a-Understanding Creative Texts-Literary Reading</u> (15% GCSE English)

Understanding a written text-Characterisation:

<u>Characterisation</u> relates to how characters are described, through their actions, speech or thoughts.

Question:

Explore the ways Lennie is presented in Chapter 5 in the novel *Of Mice and Men*. You must refer to other parts of the novel in support of your answer.

Consider the following points in detail:

Introduction:

- Explain what background information you know on the novel.
- Add a few sentences explaining your views on Lennie's character, based on your reading of the novel.

Main Body:

Paragraph One:

 Discuss Lennie's obsession with soft things and how this often gets him into trouble. Consider how it has led to problems in the past. Quote and SALAAL

Paragraph Two:

 Discuss Lennie and how he is viewed by the other characters in the novel. Quote and SALAAL

Paragraph Three:

 Discuss what happens in the barn with the puppy and then Curley's wife. Quote and SALAAL

Paragraph Four:

 Discuss what happens with Lennie by the end of the novel. Quote and SALAAL

Conclusion:

 Sum up your views on how Steinbeck has presented and developed Lennie in Of Mice and Men paying particular attention to Chapter 5.
