- THEMES: Survival/Adventure/Isolation/Trust/Friendship
- LANGUAGE: Ellipsis/Short Snappy/Personification/Symbolism/Motivational/Negative Language/Verbs/Adjectives/Nature/Landscape
- Foreshadowing/Narrative Hook
- Narrative Perspective-Point of View-Joe and Simon

Of Mice and Men:

- THEMES: Loneliness/Violence/Dreams
- LANGUAGE: simple/descriptive/uses dialect common to characters
- Foreshadowing events-signs of trouble
- Parallel events-Candy and his dog/George and Lennie-find others
